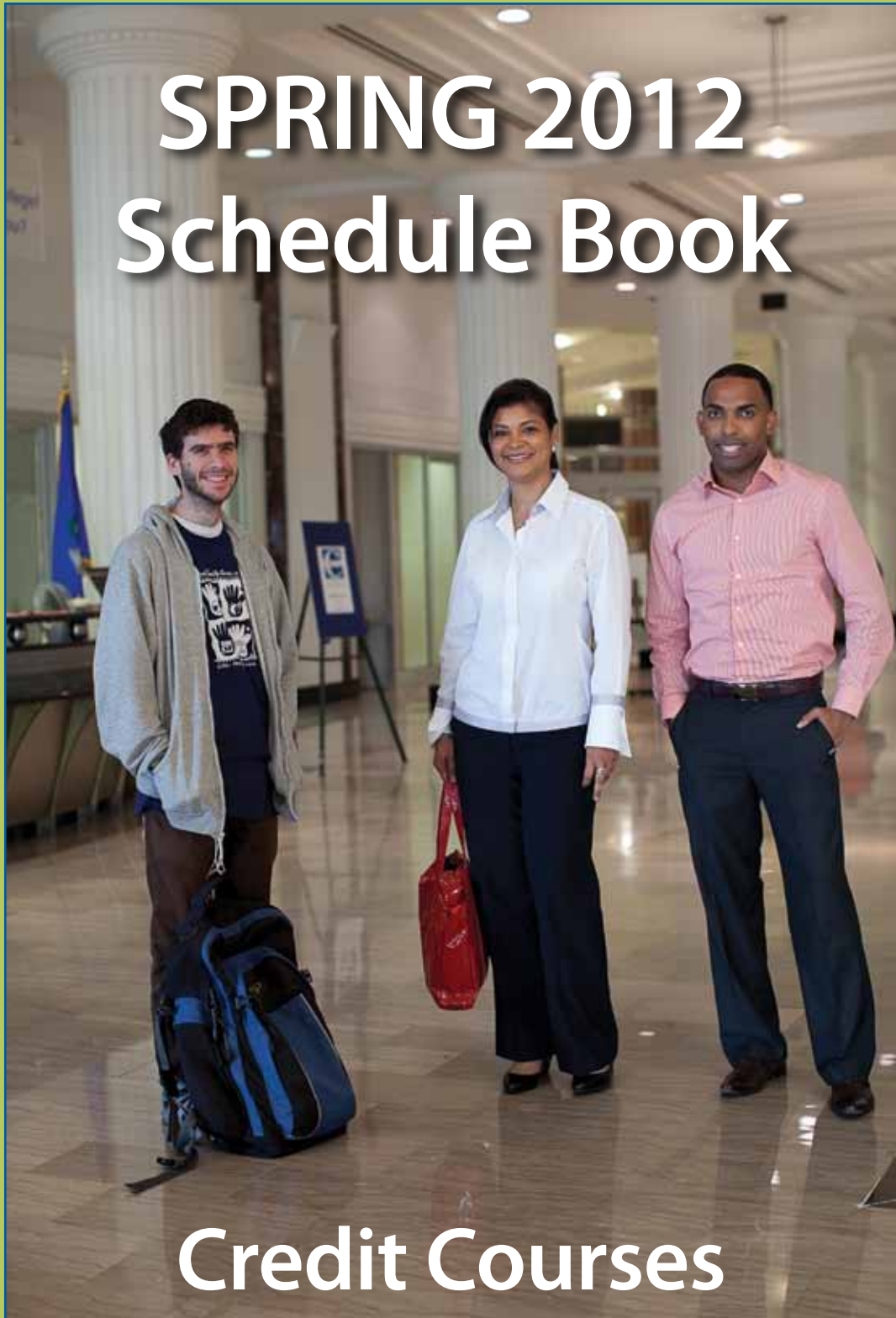

## Payment Policy

Make payments at the College on the day you register. Payment may be made by cash, check, MasterCard, Visa or Discover. Check or money order should be made payable to "CCC." Students owing the College money, library books or fines will not be allowed to register until all debts are settled. Registration is not final until payment is made in full or other satisfactory payment arrangements have been made. Any student paying with a check that is not honored by a banking institution will be subject to being deregistered and will be obligated to pay a returned check fee of \$25. The student will be given ten calendar days to make restitution with cash or a bank money order. If payment is not received within ten calendar days, the student will be deregistered and not permitted to return to class.

## Final Payment

Returning students who pre-register for the Spring 2012 semester must pay all Tuition and Fees by December 9, 2011. Students not paying all tuition and fees by this date may be "deregistered" (removed from the registration list).

# Tuition & Fee Installment Plan Agreement

Beginning December 9, 2011, students must either Pay in Full or enter into a Payment Plan Agreement. To utilize the installment plan students must be registered for six or more credits, or for an Extension Course costing a total of at least \$690. The initial payment will include all fees, twenty-five dollar (\$25) installment plan fee, and one-third of student's total tuition or Extension Course Fee. See schedule below.

**Students who advance register** and pay fees only at that time may opt for the tuition installment plan, if they request so by the final tuition payment date, December 9, 2011. These students will be required to pay one-third tuition at that time and the \$25 plan charge.

**First semester international students** will not be eligible for this plan. Continuing international students will be eligible after the successful completion of their first semester. The Foreign Student Advisor must approve all International students for eligibility.

**Refunds of tuition** will be contingent based upon the appropriate College Refund Policy. Fees for General Fund courses are not refundable. The Business Office will try to send payment reminders to students.

**If students need to be deregistered**, the Business Office will provide the Registrar with a list of names and in seven days they will either resolve the matter or de-register the student.

**Failure to meet the full payment** of this plan on or before the dates indicated may make the student subject to any or all of the following: cancellation of registration, denial of transcript and/or Certificate services and denial of registration for additional courses at Capital Community College. Additionally, the College will forward this matter to a collection agency. Once a student has been deregistered from the College, full payment will be required for reinstatement.

## Refund Policy

**General Fund (CREDIT COURSES)** — If the College cancels a course, you are entitled to a full refund of all tuition and fees. If you drop a course, the fees are non-refundable. 100 percent of the tuition paid is refundable if the course is dropped prior to January 20, 2012. A refund of 50 percent of tuition may be granted if the course is dropped by February 2, 2012. Forms are available at the Enrollment Services Office, Room 207. After February 2, 2012 there is no refund of tuition. To be considered for an exception to this policy due to extenuating circumstances, a written request, accompanied by supporting documents, can be made to the Dean of Student Services.

**Continuing Education Extension Fund Credit and Equivalent Non-Credit Developmental Courses** — When the College cancels a course, the student has the option of transferring into another course within the same semester, or requesting a refund. Refunds are issued within 4 to 6 weeks. When a student drops a course by the last regular business day of the college before the first meeting of the course, a full refund will be processed, except for the fees and non-refundable \$20 application fee for credit courses. To drop a course, contact the Office of Continuing Education at 860-906-5130.

Full or partial refunds are NOT issued after the last regular business day of the college before the first meeting of the course. A student may officially withdraw from a credit course any time after the first scheduled class, but before the end of the last day of class. The final examination day is not considered as a class day. Refunds are not issued to students who withdraw. To initiate the withdrawal process, or for more information, contact the Counseling Office, at 860-906-5040.

**PLEASE NOTE: If you register for a course, you are responsible for payment whether or not you attend.** Do not assume you will be deregistered for a course if you do not pay. See above paragraph.

Do not assume you will be deregistered for a course if you do not pay. Tuition cannot be transferred to other semesters.

Refund appeals will only be considered for the following extraordinary circumstances: severe illness documented by a physician's certificate, administrative error by the College, or military transfer documented by a copy of transfer orders.

The following circumstances will not be considered: change in employment situation, misunderstanding of start date or dates of class, inability to transfer course, normal illness, transportation issues, poor decision or change of mind by student regarding course selection, or dissatisfaction with course content or instructor.

All appeals must be submitted in writing and include student ID, contact information and appropriate documentation.

Refund Appeals will only be considered during the term when the course was scheduled. Appeals submitted after the official last day of the class will not be considered. Submit Appeal Documentation to Capital Community College Division of Continuing Education, Room 316, 950 Main St., Hartford, CT 06103.

**SPECIAL NOTE TO STUDENTS:** Full payment is due upon registration. If you do not want to take a course once you have registered for it, you must submit a drop form to the Registrar's Office whether or not you have paid. If you do not drop within the allowable drop period, you are still obligated to pay for the class, whether or not you attend.

**Credit-Free Courses** — The College reserves the right to cancel courses with insufficient enrollment. If a course you have registered for is cancelled, you will be notified by phone and have the option of receiving a full refund of fees or applying your course fee to another credit-free course in the same semester. Refunds take at least 4 to 6 weeks. No refunds are issued for credit-free courses unless you withdraw 3 business days before the first class meeting, in writing or in person, to the Office of Continuing Education, 3rd Floor, 950 Main Street, Hartford, CT 06103.

# Admission & Registration Spring 2012

## New Students

1. Submit an admissions application along with a \$20 non-refundable application fee to the Enrollment Services Office. Indicate a degree or certificate program.†
2. Submit evidence of high school or GED completion: a final transcript showing graduation date and copy of a diploma, or a copy of a GED certificate.
3. If you have taken the SAT, please submit official scores. Scores sent directly from The College Board or included on the high school transcript are acceptable. SAT scores are NOT required for admission but may be used for placement into math and English courses.
4. Submit documentation of immunization for measles, mumps, rubella and varicella (chicken pox) unless exempt (see page 8). Students will not be allowed to register without proof of immunization.
5. Take the placement test (see page 9) unless exempt.
6. See a counselor in room 208 to select your courses.
7. Students may also apply online at <http://my.commnet.edu>

† Applicants who are not receiving financial aid and are paying for their own courses may choose a non-degree option (#Z999 on the program line of the application) and need not submit the documents required in #2, #3 and #4.

**NOTE:** Non-degree students are not eligible for financial aid, veteran's benefits or transfer credit.

## Returning Students

1. See a counselor in room 208 or your academic advisor to select your courses.
2. Register for courses. If you have not attended CCC for several semesters, contact the Enrollment Services Office at 860-906-5140 to see if your file is complete.

## Reminders

1. **Applying for financial aid is an additional and separate procedure from applying for admission to the College and, because processing takes 6-8 weeks, should be completed as soon as possible before the semester begins.** In addition, applicants must have an official acceptance date from the Enrollment Services Office to be eligible for Financial Aid (see page 10).
2. Students transferring from other regionally accredited institutions of higher education must have official transcripts mailed directly from the other college to the Enrollment Services Office, CCC, 950 Main Street, Hartford, CT 06103. Students must then complete a transfer evaluation request form in CCC's Enrollment Services Office, Rm 207.
3. Tuition and fees must be paid in full at the time of registration unless the student has:
  - a. received an award letter from the CCC Financial Aid Office; or
  - b. written agency/company authorization; or
  - c. utilized the Installment Plan Option (see page 6).
4. Students who wish to apply online must:
  - a. pay \$20.00 (non-refundable) application fee by credit card online;
  - b. have a valid e-mail address;
  - c. go to [www.ccc.commnet.edu](http://www.ccc.commnet.edu)

Students who do NOT make payment of tuition and fees in accordance with the payment policy may be subject to removal from their classes (de-registered).



## Special Needs

Students who have special needs or who are disabled must self-identify and provide documentation of their specific disability to a counselor. This must be done at least 60 days prior to the start of the course. This will allow the College to make an effort to accommodate special needs students. ## Veterans

## Senior Citizens

## Immunization Information FOR CREDIT STUDENTS

If you were born after December 31, 1956, Connecticut state law requires that all NEW full-time degree seeking, full-time non-degree/non-matriculating, and part-time degree seeking students enrolled in colleges or universities be adequately protected against Measles, Mumps, Rubella (German Measles) and Varicella (Chicken Pox).\*

Any one of the following documents presented to the Enrollment Services is acceptable:

- Two (2) doses of each vaccine administered at least one (1) month apart
- Blood titer test results that document immunity to MMRV
- A physician's certification that immunization would be harmful to you
- A signed statement that immunization is against your religious beliefs

\* Students born *before* January 1, 1980 are exempt from providing proof against Varicella but are required to provide Measles, Mumps and Rubella immunization information.

# NEW STUDENT PLACEMENT TESTING

## General Testing and ESL (English-As-A-Second Language) Testing

### General Placement Testing

All new students must take the Basic Skills Placement Test. The Placement Test is a computer based test designed to measure your entry level in Mathematics and English. Your results are used to place you into appropriate college courses.

#### How do I prepare for the test?

To prepare for the test, visit or call the Academic Success Center on the 4th floor of the College; 860-906-5200. Go to this link for a practice test: <http://www.ccc.commnet.edu/docs/accuplacer.pdf>. Prepare accordingly for the test!

#### Can I be exempt from the test?

Yes, you can be exempt from the test if you meet one of the following requirements:

- Completion of a college English Composition or college Mathematics course with a grade of "C" or better. (A copy of a college transcript/grade report is required.)
- Achieving a score of 450 or above on the verbal/critical reading portion of the SAT exam and/or a score of 500 or above on the Math portion of the SAT exam.
- You are 62 years old or older.

#### How do I schedule a time to take the test?

The test is on a first come, first serve basis. Students must come to Room 220 and are highly encouraged to arrive 30 minutes early for a "Welcome" workshop before the test start time.

#### What should I bring when I come to take the test?

- A photo ID (e.g., driver's license or school ID).
- Your 8 digit Banner ID Number
- A writing utensil (pen/pencil)

Scrap paper will be provided. NO CALCULATORS are allowed.

#### Can I retake the test?

**Only** in exceptional circumstances with signed permission from Dean Doris Arrington.

## Tax Credits Available

Parents sending children to college, or adults continuing their education, may take advantage of the HOPE Scholarship tax credit or the Lifetime Learning tax credit. A HOPE tax credit of up to \$1,500 can be claimed for two years for each individual enrolled at least half-time in higher education at an eligible educational institution, who has not yet completed his or her first two years of study. The credit is 100% of the first \$1,000 of payments for qualified tuition and fees, and 50% of the second \$1,000. The Lifetime Learning tax credit is available for vocational, college, graduate and professional students, for adults who want to upgrade their job skills or acquire new ones or pursue another course of study, and even for a student taking one course as long as it is job-related.

Tax filers can claim a Lifetime Learning credit up to \$1,000 - 20% of the first \$5,000 paid in qualified tuition and fees on or after July 1. A taxpayer can claim only one Lifetime Learning credit per tax year for the aggregate amount of qualified tuition and fees for those students in the family for whom no HOPE credit is claimed. There is no limit, however, on the number of years a taxpayer may claim the Lifetime Learning tax credit. To take advantage of the two credits, taxpayers must submit IRS form 8863 with their federal tax return. ## Financial Aid

The College offers a comprehensive financial aid program to assist students in meeting the cost of attending college. Through scholarships, grants, loans, and on-campus employment opportunities, the College provides financial support to help with educational expenses. The College participates in each of the federally-supported financial aid programs: Pell Grant, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Federal Work-Study, Stafford, and PLUS Loan Programs. The College also administers State of CT grant programs. Special scholarships from corporations and individuals are also available.

To become a candidate for financial aid, the student must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To be eligible, the student must be formally accepted to CCC by the Enrollment Services Office and enrolled in a degree or eligible certificate program; a citizen or permanent resident; maintaining satisfactory academic progress; pursuing a first undergraduate degree; in compliance with draft registration requirements; free from default of any previous student loans or refund obligation to any federal aid program; and determined to have financial need. Financial Aid is awarded on a first come basis; therefore, applicants are encouraged to apply as early as possible. **The priority deadline date for all students is December 1, 2011.** Please note that late financial aid applicants are expected to be prepared to pay tuition, fees and book expenses at the time of registration. ### From Interstate 84 East (from West Hartford, Farmington, etc.)

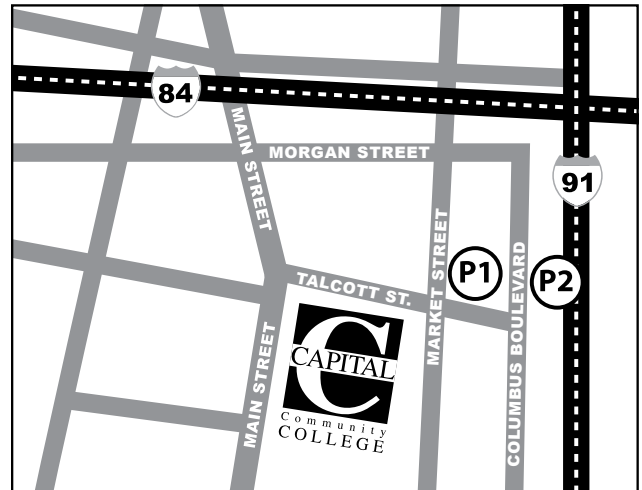
Take Exit 50 (Main St.). At third traffic light, turn right onto Market St. Take first left onto Talcott St., then first left into Garage entrance.

### From Interstate 84 West (from E. Hartford, Manchester, Route 2)

Take Exit 50 (Main St.). At bottom of ramp, turn left onto Market St. Take second left onto Talcott St., then first left into Garage entrance.

### From Interstate 91 North or South

Take Exit 32-B (Trumbull St.). At bottom of ramp, turn left onto Market St. Take third left onto Talcott St., then first left into Garage entrance.



## Parking Access Card

All registered students are eligible for a free parking access card for the Morgan Street Garage. Students need to obtain an application from the Morgan Street Garage located on the corner of Market and Talcott Streets. ## Parking for College Guests and Visitors

If you are visiting the College, free secure parking is available at the College's Columbus Boulevard lot. **Please note that if you park in the Morgan Street Garage without a College-authorized access card, it will be at your own expense.** The Columbus Boulevard lot is located on a one-way street between Morgan and Talcott Streets.

**From Points North and South** – 91 North to Exit 32-B (Trumbull Street). Ramp ends at traffic light, turn left onto Market Street. At the second traffic light turn left onto Morgan Street and then a right onto Columbus Boulevard. The lot entrance will be on the left.

**From Points East** – 84 West to Exit 50 (Main Street). At the bottom of ramp, turn left onto Market Street, go to 1st traffic light and take a left onto Morgan Street and a right onto Columbus Boulevard. The lot entrance will be on the left.

**From Points West** – 84 East to Exit 50 (Main Street). After 4th traffic light go right onto Columbus Boulevard and the lot entrance will be on the left.



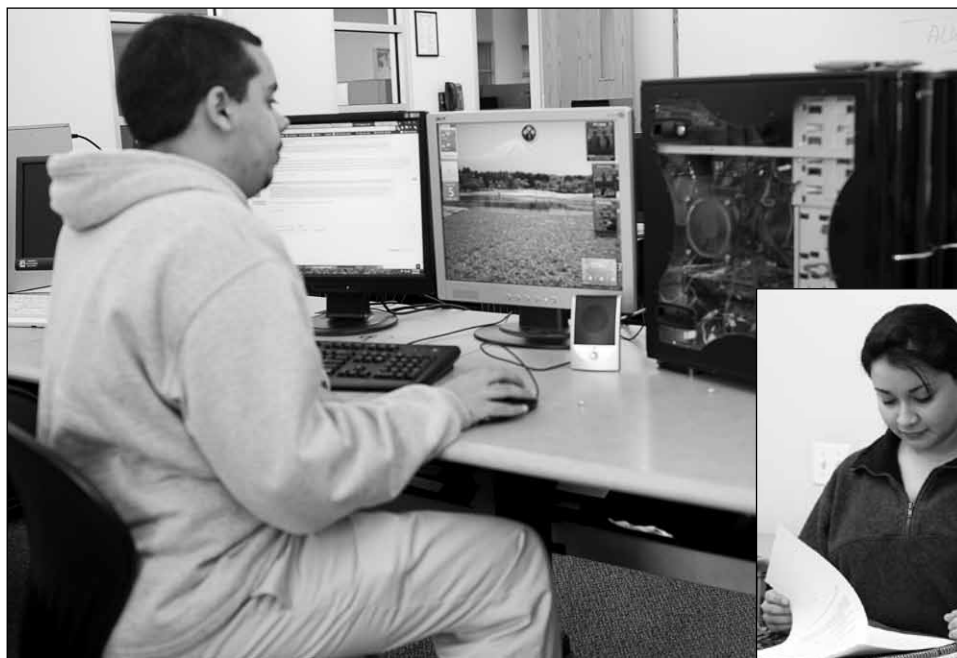

A COUPLE OF SAMPLES FROM THE SITE:

Sentences are defined according to function: **declarative** (most of the sentences we use), **interrogative** (which ask a question – “What’s your name?”), **exclamatory** (“There’s a fire in the kitchen!”), and **imperative** (“Don’t drink that!”)

The word **which** can be used to introduce both restrictive and nonrestrictive clauses, although many writers use it exclusively to introduce nonrestrictive clauses; the word **that** can be used to introduce only restrictive clauses. Some writers insist that the word **that** cannot be used to refer to people, but in situations where the people are not specifically named, it is acceptable.

E.g., *The students that study most usually do the best.*

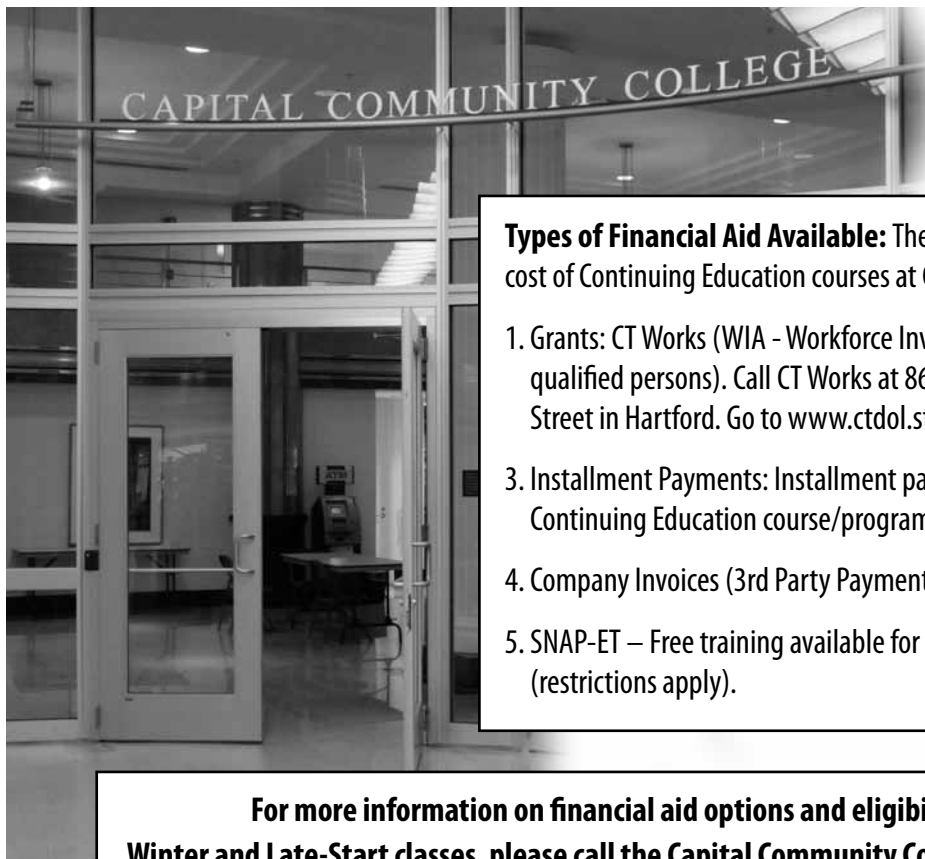

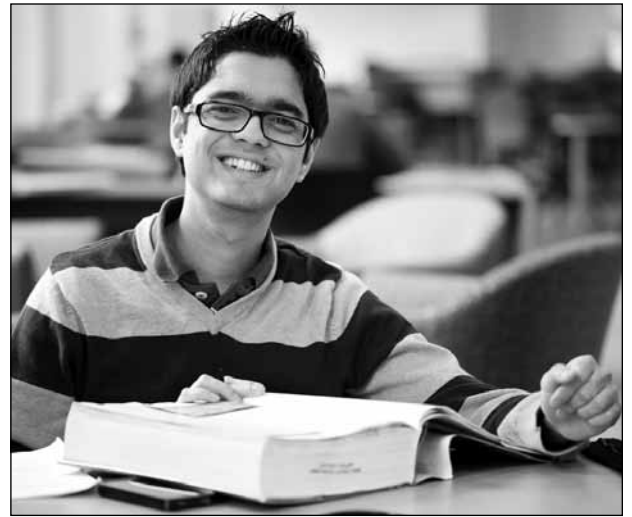
